Pursuant to paragraphs 45 and 60 of the International Bureau Order released on June 15, 2009 in the above-referenced proceeding (*see* Order and Request for Further Comment, IB Docket No. 09-10, rel. June 15, 2009, DA 09-1325), Verizon files this report concerning its circuits on the U.S.-Tonga route.

Verizon previously has engaged in communications with the Tonga Communications Corporation (“TCC”) regarding re-opening Verizon’s circuits in light of the June 8, 2010, announcement that the Tonga Ministry of Information and Communications will no longer be setting a regulatory minimum settlement rate or access charge for all inbound international telephone calls. For the time being, Verizon is not pursuing further negotiations with TCC.
