On September 19, 2012, Caroline H. Little, Chief Executive Officer of the Newspaper Association of America, Paul J. Boyle, Senior Vice President/Public Policy of the Newspaper Association of America, accompanied by the undersigned, met with Chairman Genachowski, William T. Lake, Chief of the Media Bureau, Sherrese Smith, Chief Counsel to the Chairman, Elizabeth Andrion, Acting Chief of the Office of Strategic Planning and Policy Analysis, and Lyle Elder, Attorney-Advisor, Office of the Chairman, to discuss current issues of concern to the newspaper industry.

During the discussion, the NAA participants were asked about NAA's positions on issues relating to the above-captioned docket. In response, the NAA participants discussed the positions taken by NAA in comments filed by the NAA on March 5, 2012, including the need for greater flexibility for investments in newspaper companies by companies that also own television licensees, the need for ownership relief in small as well as large markets, and NAA's agreement with the Commission's proposal to eliminate the cross-ownership restriction relating to ownership of newspapers and radio licensees.
