Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, DISH Network Corporation ("DISH") submits this letter summarizing telephone calls on Thursday, September 20, 2012 and Friday, September 21, 2012 to several Commission staff from Jeffrey Blum, Senior Vice President and Deputy General Counsel for DISH.

During separate calls on September 20 with David Goldman, Senior Legal Advisor for Commissioner Rosenworcel, and Zachary Katz, Chief of Staff for Chairman Julius Genachowski, DISH summarized the results of the study it submitted in the above referenced dockets on September 17, 2012 regarding the substantial interference concerns to the AWS-4 uplink were the Commission to shift the S-Band up 5 MHz to 2005-2025 MHz.¹ DISH urged the Commission to complete this rulemaking as expeditiously as possible, and maintain the existing band plan consistent with the AWS-4 NPRM. DISH also provided an update on the status of its coordination agreement regarding certain government facilities located in spectrum adjacent to the S-Band downlink frequencies at 2180-2200 MHz.

During a call on September 21 with John Leibovitz, Deputy Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, DISH again provided an update on the status of the coordination agreement referenced above, as well as discussed protection of GPS operations.
