
Dear Chairman Genachowski,

We have the unfortunate opportunity of having a son in prison. What with how expensive gasoline is, we cannot drive down to see him as often as we would like. Thankfully though Texas just put offender telephones in its prisons. The problem with that is -- much the same way as it was when he was in the county jail -- the calls add up to a small fortune. We cannot afford but to except a fraction of his calls each month.

However, now that my mother has been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, we accept each and every one of his calls; him and my mother are very close and we want him to spend as much time with her on the telephone as he can -- despite the huge debt we are going into paying for it.

It is maddening the telephone companies contracting with the State can reap such huge fees. Technology now-a-days enables us to communicate with people half way around the world for less than it cost to talk to my son a few counties down and over. We write in hopes of the FCC putting an end to high prison telephone cost.
