

This is a brief comment on Westfax's petition.

First of all, I entirely agree with RICHARD S. ALEMBIK's comments.

Second, I am charged for my e-fax line--a fixed charge for which I get a small "bucket" of faxes. For every fax beyond that, I am charged an additional fee. So, in addition to consuming bandwidth, space on my disk, resources in my email system, resources on my smart phone (and connection thereof), I'm actually using a scarce and paid-for resource to receive these junk faxes.

As previously noted, it is the SENDING of the junk fax that violates the TCPA. Quite likely, receiving junk efaxes is both a large expense pushed on me without my permission and more of an imposition on my privacy.

Follow the law. These are the same as or worse than conventional junk faxes.
