
Greetings.

In this letter I am referring to Section 63.71 Application of Working Assets Funding Service Inc. dba Credo Long Distance

Working Assets, operating as themselves and as Credo have frequently pointed out in their advertising that they are the only source of a calling card that is friendly to my concerns. I have seen calling cards offered by companies that have diverted billions to politicians that act as traitors to the American Constitution and Declaration of Independence. Many of them support bombing of civilians in other countries, illegal surveillance of civilians in this country, and open attempts to prevent us from voting for our choice of leaders. I have never seen any company advertise that they will work with us for a better country, or help us to lobby our representatives, as Working Assets did. But as I won't take a job that involves surveillance or torture, I haven't had a job in 3 years. Most of their customers are in my position. I can only think that this letter is a cruel hoax, that Working Assets has always been a branch of government surveillance, or that they are now violating their own business plan. None of these options are acceptable.
