Dear Chairman Genachowski:


I had the opportunity to play a leading role in the rebuilding of the Mississippi Gulf Coast's housing market after Hurricane Katrina. What was dubbed and affectionately remains the "Katrina Cottage" is a small (300sf), affordable (\$25,000) structure that became home to thousands.

You see, when we had to rebuild after Katrina, we needed an affordable, accessible option for folks who found themselves without homes. Affordable accessibility is a trend in our struggling economy, and is a shoe that fits the broadband empire as well as the housing market.

LightSquared has been working for years to develop an affordable, accessible network that will provide wireless broadband to Americans from coast to coast. And with spectrum limited; costs skyrocketing; and competition weak, it is time to introduce a new product to the broadband arena. LightSquared is within sight of the finish line of their investment in affordable, accessible broadband and has applied for a license modification, which will propel them to the end of the race.

By granting their application to walk away from their spectrum that has caused GPS interference issues, and instead share spectrum with NOAA, the FCC will be doing more than allowing them to deploy their network. Your agency will be delivering affordable, accessible broadband to a nation who needs it, and I urge you to grant their license modification.
