Dear Ms. Dortch:

AT&T Inc. (“AT&T”) submits this letter to clarify its September, 2008 “in-part” election regarding the transmission of emergency alerts to its subscribers through the Commercial Mobile Alert System (“CMAS”).¹

When AT&T filed its original CMAS election letter in 2008, it did so on behalf of itself and several wireless businesses affiliated with AT&T.² AT&T and the associated businesses listed in Appendix A of the September 8th letter chose to do so out of an abundance of caution as to the CMAS obligations of the parties.

As AT&T deployed CMAS functionality across its networks, including those areas in which the associated businesses operate, we were advised by senior Federal Emergency Management Agency (“FEMA”) officials that AT&T’s original election letter had resulted in each of the associated businesses being listed in the Commission’s records as an independent CMAS network provider. These FEMA officials further advised AT&T that so long as the Commission’s records listed each associated business as an independent CMAS network provider, FEMA would consider CMAS network availability in these areas as incomplete.

Given that AT&T is solely responsible for CMAS network functionality in each operating area of each associated business, and that none of the parties to the September 8th letter intended this recordkeeping result, AT&T hereby amends the September 8th letter to reflect that it is solely responsible for CMAS network functionality in these areas and CMAS is available in each of the operating areas of the associated businesses. In addition, AT&T respectfully requests that the Commission to modify its CMAS records to reflect the facts of this letter by deleting each of the associated businesses listed in Appendix A of the September 8th letter as CMAS network providers.
