Dear Chairman Genachowski:

I am concerned about the lack of affordable high-speed wireless broadband services – especially in rural parts of our country. I have recently learned about a company and its efforts to rectify this inequity.

LightSquared is proposing a unique wholesale model of service that could greatly benefit rural Missouri. As I understand it, LightSquared's planned network would immediately enable a much smaller provider to partner with a national provider and immediately develop a 4G strategy that would benefit the customers of rural Missouri. Without a partnership similar to what LightSquared is offering, it is nearly impossible for a smaller telecommunications provider to enter the market and offer a nationwide 4G service to customers.

It is for these reasons and more that I have decided to write you and register my opinion along with many others in support of LightSquared and its license modification application.

I am very encouraged by the company's latest effort to reach a compromise so that it can finally deploy its wholesale network. LightSquared has offered to give up its rights to use the spectrum that caused interference with GPS devices in return for approval to enter into a spectrum sharing agreement with the federal government. This seems like a fair compromise and I hope that we can both agree that compromise is the most reasonable way forward.

I hope you will move with haste and grant LightSquared's license modification application. Thank you for your consideration. I appreciate your attention to this matter.
