Dear Chairman Genachowski:

I want to register my support during this comment period for LightSquared and its effort to launch a nationwide mobile broadband network. I also want to urge the FCC to approve LightSquared's License Modification Application and allow the company to finally move forward.

I have recently become aware of LightSquared's ongoing efforts to build a competitive nationwide mobile broadband network and applaud the company's willingness to put forth a solution that will extinguish previous concerns regarding interference with GPS devices.

The company, as I understand the latest proposal, will voluntarily relinquish its authority over 10MHz of spectrum adjacent to GPS spectrum, thus providing a significant buffer zone against interference. In exchange, LightSquared needs the FCC's approval to allow the company to share neighboring spectrum with the federal government. With this reasonable compromise, the company can finally launch its network and Americans can finally benefit from expanded competition in the market.

As you stated late last year in a speech, technology is not the only hurdle for developing increased broadband capacity, but "it also requires massive amounts of private capital." LightSquared has already invested over \$4 billion in its network. The government ought not hinder this kind of significant investment in a critical infrastructure.
