The wireless industry is increasingly important to education and jobs and the American economy. I think that every American should have access to wireless services and thus be able to benefit from technology.

I am a small business owner from Ozark, Missouri and I have followed LightSquared's developments through the news and felt compelled to lend my support for this company.

As you know, the Commission is tasked with ensuring "that the American people have available – at reasonable costs and without discrimination – rapid, efficient, nationwide and worldwide communication services." But, as Chairman Genachowski noted in a speech last fall, technology is not the only hurdle for developing increased broadband capacity, "it also requires massive amounts of private capital." LightSquared has already invested over \$4 billion into making this network a reality.

The Commission should approve of LightSquared's request so it the company can finally move forward and provide a nationwide wireless broadband service.
