Dear Chairman Genachowski:

These days, a business can only thrive with high-speed, wireless access to the internet. Small and local businesses are often unable to succeed without an online presence and it's even harder for a business to succeed in rural areas underserved by broadband providers. Without access to not only the Internet, but mobile broadband as well, our economic recovery will continue to be lackluster. That's why I support LightSquared's proposal to build a new nationwide mobile broadband network.

As I understand it, LightSquared's proposal would combine its licensed spectrum with other spectrum utilized by the federal government in exchange for foregoing spectrum that was the source of much controversy with GPS devices.

In reviewing the recent comments regarding the LightSquared's proceedings, there is almost universal agreement that the FCC should facilitate the use of limited spectrum and allow LightSquared to move forward to bring a significant swath of spectrum on-line with a nationwide mobile broadband network.

It is time that we cut through the bureaucratic hurdles and red tape and ensure that residents and businesses – especially those in rural areas – have reliable access to broadband spectrum. I urge the Commission to approve LightSquared's request.
