**REPLY COMMENTS**

Mediacom Communications Corporation (“Mediacom”), by its attorneys, hereby replies to the comments submitted in response to the Wireline Competition Bureau’s December 5, 2012 and December 10, 2012 Public Notices seeking comment on areas listed as “unserved” by the National Broadband Map for purposes of the Connect America Fund’s Phase I (“CAF I”) incremental support. In its Comments, based on a review of the list of potentially unserved census blocks in price cap territories provided with the December 10, 2012 Public Notice, Mediacom identified 1439 census blocks in its service territories, 840 located in the Mississippi and 599 located in Indiana, where Mediacom advertises and provides service to at least one customer with a fixed terrestrial internet access service operating speeds well in excess of the 3 Mbps downstream and 768 kbps upstream minimum standard. Accordingly, those areas should be deemed “served” for purposes of CAF I support.


In response to comments submitted by other parties and as directed by the Public Notices, Mediacom has reviewed claims that particular service areas listed as served should be reclassified as “unserved” or “partially served.” That review is ongoing but is not yet complete. Specifically, Mediacom is still in the process of reviewing the 4000+ page submission by CenturyLink claiming that almost 195,000 Census blocks with over 3.3 million homes are

incorrectly listed as served area. Given the sheer scale of analyzing CenturyLink's submission and specific claims, and that CenturyLink and Mediacom's service areas covering 22 states significantly overlap, Mediacom is not in a position today to confirm one way or another any of CenturyLink's claims. Mediacom technical and operational staff are actively working on this analysis. Should the analysis reveal that particular areas within Mediacom service territories should remain classified as "served," Mediacom will submit into the record appropriate supporting evidence and request relief to file such data into the record. Mediacom will also make sure to timely inform CenturyLink and state mapping agencies of its findings.
