In response to the aforementioned petition by Mr. Martin, as representative of LifeTalk Radio, I respectfully ask that the Commission deny the petition which LifeTalk has proposed. This is not based on their content - it is based upon the premise that basically, a "satellator" station can be classified as "local."


A local entity owns an LPFM station that has carried LifeTalk. The ownership is local. However, this station is locked away in a church sound room. They have no means of producing local content and have, in fact, borrowed our studio to record station promos and such. If I wanted to produce and air a local Christian program on this station, it would not be possible.

I am a prospective LPFM applicant. The studios will be fully functional, including having microphones for in-studio guests. Our music will be programmed in-house. Lord willing, I will personally be live on the air six days per week. The LPFM format I am proposing is totally unique and unduplicated in this market.

LPFM was supposed to be established as a way to help bring radio back to the people. I urge the Commission to, please, give some of us little guys a chance. I have no desire to be a satellator station. I believe our communities deserve better, and mostly, I am not seeing that happen.

Thank you, FCC, for the LPFM opportunity. I do see this as my last hope to re-enter broadcasting.
