**PETITION TO ADOPT CONDITIONS TO
AUTHORIZATIONS AND LICENSES**

The Department of Justice (“DOJ”), The Federal Bureau of Investigation (“FBI”), and The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (“DHS”), (the “USG Parties”) submits this Petition to Adopt Conditions to Authorizations and Licenses (Petition), pursuant to Section 1.41 of the Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) rules.¹ Through this Petition, the USG Parties advises the Commission that it has no objection to the Commission approving the authority sought in the above-referenced proceedings, provided that the Commission conditions its approval on the assurance of T-Mobile/MetroPCS, to abide by the commitments and undertakings set forth in the Agreement dated January 12, 2001 and the Amendment No. 2, dated March 5, 2013 (“Amendment”), which is attached hereto. In the above-referenced proceedings, the Applicant requests Commission consent to the transfer of *de jure* control of section 214 authorizations (WC DK 12-301) held by MetroPCS. After discussions with representatives of the Applicant in connection with the above-referenced proceedings, the USG Parties

have concluded that the additional commitments set forth in the Amendment will help ensure that the USG Parties with responsibility for enforcing the law, protecting the national security, and preserving public safety, can proceed appropriately to satisfy those responsibilities. Accordingly, the USG Parties advises the Commission that it has no objection to the Commission granting the application in the above-referenced proceedings, provided that the Commission conditions its consent on compliance by T-Mobile/MetroPCS with the Amendment.
