

I recently bought a new Hyundai Elantra car. Nowhere in the brochure or another place advertising the car I had found a mention of the fact that the car is not equipped with a spare tire. Only just at the time of the closing the deal for purchase of the car, it was pointed out to me for the first time that the car did not have a spare tire as standard equipment, but I had to spend additional money to buy it. I know the reason. The company boasts about the great mileage per gallon for Elantra, but they do not disclose that this mileage comes at the additional cost of buying the spare tire and wheel. It is a false advertisement by the company to fool the consumer. In fact, only recently the FCC successfully won the case against the company for falsifying the mileage per gallon given by the car. I shall greatly appreciate if you kindly investigate this matter. The price of the wheel and tire quoted to me by the dealer was somewhere between \$1500-2000. I have never before bought a new car (I have bought at least 15 over the last 40 years) where I had to buy a spare tire for my new vehicle.
