We are the only two counties in the entire state that cannot receive Denver TV! It is frustrating watching news and weather that have little meaning to us. We pay taxes in Colorado and need to know what is happening in the Colorado legislature.

Cable customers are allowed to watch the Denver stations for the exact time the news is on, but that is it. When the news goes off the station is blacked out. If a program runs long and the news is delayed or runs long, it doesn't matter, the station is blacked out.
