**Re: EX PARTE PRESENTATION: Emergency Petition of Sprint Nextel for Limited Waiver and Clarification filed March 5, 2013 in CG Docket Nos. 13-24 and 03-123.**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 12, 2013, the undersigned counsel received a phone call from Eliot Greenwald, an attorney with the Federal Communications Commission's Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau (CGB) in which he stated that CGB was considering the merits of Sprint's above-referenced emergency petition but that it needed more information. Specifically, he asked whether a WebCapTel user who turns off his computer without closing the CapTel application or a Wireless CapTel user who turns off her mobile device without closing the CapTel application would have to enter his/her id and password when the user turns on the computer or mobile device.

Users of WebCapTel or Wireless CapTel who have shut down their computers or mobile devices must take the same steps described in Sprint's Petition (at pages 3-4) once they turn on their computers or mobile devices. Stated differently, the WebCapTel application and the Wireless CapTel application closes when users turn off their devices containing such applications.<sup>1</sup>

Mr. Greenwald also asked that Sprint provide the percentage of IP Captel minutes submitted by Sprint for compensation that is being generated by Sprint's provision of WebCapTel and Wireless CapTel services. In January 2013 \* \* \* **BEGIN CONFIDENTIAL** \* \* \*

Finally, although this issue was not part of the *ex parte* discussion, Sprint wishes to clarify that the waiver it is requesting is applicable to the period beginning March 7, 2013. This clarification is necessary to ensure that Sprint will be compensated for the WebCapTel and


