Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 28, 2013, Sprint Nextel Corporation (“Sprint”) representatives met with Federal Communications Commission staff members regarding the above-referenced proceeding. I attended the meeting in person. Also attending for Sprint via telephone were Harry Perlow, Sprint, Technology Development Strategist; John Humbert, Sprint, Technology Development Strategist – Global Standards; and Sean Haynberg, V-COMM, L.L.C., Director RF Technologies. FCC participants were Jeremy Marcus, Matthew Pearl, Blaise Scinto, Janet Young, Sayuri Rajapakse (via telephone), and Brian Regan of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau; and Michael Ha of the Office of Engineering & Technology.

During the meeting, Sprint representatives reviewed the H Block device interference testing that had been conducted by V-COMM and presented in Sprint’s H Block Reply Comments.¹ Sprint representatives indicated that the six tested devices came from four different manufacturers and encompassed a variety of designs that are typical of CDMA PCS devices. While Sprint submits that the existing testing is sufficient for the Commission to consider adopting Sprint’s proposed mobile device power limits and out-of-band emission limits, Sprint intends to conduct testing of additional H Block devices and submit those results into the record in the near future. Sprint representatives also indicated that other wireless operators are also likely to file test results soon.
