
Dear Ms. Dortch:

Charter has explained that grant of its requested temporary waiver from the integration ban to deploy integrated security devices that also support downloadable security will facilitate a faster and more efficient transition to an all-digital network, while still supporting both the CableCARD platform and a new downloadable security system. This letter is to provide additional assurances.

As conditions for deploying integrated security devices pursuant to this temporary two-year waiver:

- (1) Charter will convert 100% of its systems—including its entire rural footprint—to all-digital within nine months after the end of the two-year waiver.
- (2) Charter will make broadband Internet access service of 100 Mbps or greater available to 200,000 additional homes within two years of grant of the waiver.
- (3) Charter will continue to provide CableCARDS for new CableCARD devices until such time as a third-party retail device with downloadable security is available for use by Charter subscribers.
