

Trying to make one report leads to another and I will comment on the inability to make calls to various police departments this morning as well as another case of apparent exploitation of a young woman similar to the report of January 26th. I will start with a comment of the latter. When entering ceasers at Lomas and San Mateo after opening a bank account, I noticed that the Banker Adam had not opened my account with the requested deposit of 100 dollars after ordering my food. When I walked to the bank the doors were locked, however the new debit card initiated at the ATM. When I sat at the South-West corner of the resturaunt and started to type a comment in this dialogue box I noticed that a woman and girl were sitting a few benches to the North of me. A woman came in to Ceasers and said something like I don't have a computer. A call to APD led to more questions about what I had with no comment on the suspicious woman. The woman entered a silver vehicle and when I moved to the opposite corner of the resturaunt (North-East) corner of the resturant. The tags were out of state tags that I did not recognize and the silver van drove on the south side of the resturant close to the building as it drove eastward (as if to pull in to the drive through), however never appeared in my line of sight as I viewed out of the east windows. The silver mini-van did not have on of its hub caps. A conversation with the Champaign County call taker (presumably I dialed the correct number) about the silver mini-van yielded a "we can't help you here" response. I noticed that door at the enterence into the hallway with the restrooms opened and probably someone probably peeked out. A young Indian woman that I have seen working there before walked in the customer enterance/ exit on the west side of the building and sat at a bench immediately to my bench not long after the Woman and girl left and got in a minivan parked on the west side of the parking lot (approximatly half way from North-most to South-most). I had seen the young woman with an adult woman before (if I am not mistaken) and it was during a similar crime scene. The Indian female employee appeared to come through the door to the hallway with the bathrooms (exiting from the bathroom side to the lobby side (south to north) without entering throught the same door as if to demonstrate that people do not have to enter through that door to exit from that door. I walked to the corner of the premesis at the South-East corner of Lomas and San-Mateo and called APD (Albuquerque) regarding the loss of my sunglasses and the

possibility of the theft from Ceasers. It is important to note that losses of sunglasses has been a reoccurring problem at Bank of Americas and Wells Fargo in the Albuquerque Area during my banking sessions (and the loss may be related to the opening of a new account). The typing of the second incident (and less important incident) "in a reasonably large amount of detail" has left less time an available effort for the "first and more important incident" involving repeated burglaries and non-answers from out of state police and sheriffs department that I have reported related crimes (syndromes to "laterally apply" a medical term to a re-occurring crime sequence). Perhaps accessing a report to the copyright technology office that was typed at a library in the Houston area at a Library a few miles North of FM1960 near airport road (only a small portion of the community center was open (the up-stairs of the Library)) a few years ago) would help (I discussed event sequences and probablilities). Maybe I will return to the first event later.
