

I STRONGLY oppose any changes to the current FCC standards that would allow television and radio stations to broadcast profanity and nudity on the public airwaves. Current broadcast decency law prohibits expletives and nudity, even if brief or fleeting. The Supreme Court has confirmed the FCC's authority to enforce this policy, especially during times when children are likely to be watching or listening.

Relaxing the current policy would not serve the public interest. In fact, it would have a negative effect. I urge the FCC to reject all proposals that would allow for the broadcast of expletives and nudity on FCC-licensed stations.
