

I oppose any changes to the current FCC indecency standards that would allow television and radio stations to broadcast expletives and nudity on the public airwaves, even if brief or "fleeting."

Many broadcasts are already offensive to many viewers and unacceptable for family viewing and entertainment. The right to free speech on "public" airways should not be used to subject parts of the public to violent material, language, photography etc that offends a portion of that public, and thereby limits their usage of these "public" airways including their children. The operative word is offensive to others. The general public or audience should all be able to view a show or listen to radio without being offended. The FCC has allowed way too much "free speech" already that has ruined the at home television experience for many families and individuals like myself. Watching tv and finding shows for your family in the past only took a click of the on switch as all shows were acceptable. Now, you must muddle through over a dozen shows to find decent television (as well as decent radio music broadcasts) to watch or listen to.

Furthermore, airways that are purchased independently to be viewed such as premium stations not available thru a basic cable subscription, should be used for "freedom of speech" expressions that the public can purchase who are not offended and find interest in such types of programming etc.

Relaxing the current policy would not serve the public interest and I urge the FCC to reject all proposals that would allow for the broadcast of expletives and nudity on FCC-licensed stations.
