On April 3, 2013, Doug Smith, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer of LightSquared, Jeffrey Carlisle, Executive Vice President – Regulatory Affairs and Public Policy of LightSquared, Amy Mehlman of Mehlman Capitol Strategies, Inc., and Jeffrey L. Turner of Patton Boggs LLP, met with Commissioner Ajit Pai and his Legal Advisor Courtney Reinhard. The discussion focused upon the compelling need to find spectrum-based, technical, legal, or other solutions to the current issues involving LightSquared, including necessary regulatory approvals to move forward in the near term as well as the LightSquared proposals that are detailed in its May 17, 2012 Notice of Ex Parte Presentation in the L Band Proceedings (pages 4-6), and its April 25, 2012 letter (pages 3-4), May 17, 2012 comments (pages 4-8), and June 1, 2012 reply in the 2 GHz Proceedings (pages 5-6). The LightSquared Representatives stressed the Company’s continuing desire and intention to deploy a nationwide 4G wireless broadband network, and its hope that the Commission will work with LightSquared, NTIA, and other agencies to develop on an expedited basis spectrum solutions to enable LightSquared to deploy its network.
