Dear Ms. Dortch:

I spoke via telephone about the above-referenced proceeding with Matthew Berry, Chief of Staff, Commissioner Pai on April 7, and with Karen Peltz Strauss and Rosaline Crawford of the Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau on April 8. In each case I discussed the limits of the FCC's statutory authority under Sections 716 and 718 of the Communications Act as regards software, the need to ensure that manufacturers are not required to pass through technology formats for accessibility purposes that they do not pass through generally, that Section 716 does not require a manufacturer to support third-party accessibility software that it does not pre-load onto a device, and whether browsers can be considered the terminus point for information consumers obtain from sources on the Internet.
