

I oppose any changes to the current FCC indecency standards that would allow television and radio stations to broadcast expletives and nudity on the public airwaves, even if brief or "fleeting." I just wrote to a station complaining of their commercials depicting mostly nude women in a sexually compromising manner making out. It aired during a mid-afternoon show and was viewed by my young son as we were watching a family-oriented show. That is unacceptable.

The Supreme Court has confirmed the FCC's authority to enforce policies regarding expletives and nudity, especially during times when children are likely to be watching or listening. However, if I feel compelled to write to multiple stations to complain about some of the smut I've seen on television lately, the FCC doesn't appear to be doing its due diligence in upholding the current standards.

Relaxing the current policy would not serve the public interest and I urge the FCC to reject all proposals that would allow for the broadcast of expletives and nudity on FCC-licensed stations.
