Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 11, 2013, on behalf of Apple Inc., Rob Carter and I met with Matthew Berry, Chief of Staff, Commissioner Pai about the above-referenced proceeding. We discussed the limits of the FCC's statutory authority under Sections 716 and 718 of the Communications Act as regards software, the need to ensure that manufacturers are not required to pass through technology formats for accessibility purposes that they do not pass through generally, that Section 716 does not require a manufacturer to support third-party accessibility software that it does not pre-load onto a device, and whether browsers can be considered the terminus point for information consumers obtain from sources on the Internet.
