

I strongly oppose any changes to the current FCC indecency standards that would allow television and radio stations to broadcast expletives and nudity on the public airwaves, even if brief or "fleeting."

In 2004, I wrote a Resolution entitled "Decency in Broadcasting" for the NJSFWC, which was passed by 14,000 NJ concerned women, and was sent to the FCC. I know that many women and men throughout the country stand behind a message such as this.

The Supreme Court has confirmed the FCC's authority to enforce policies regarding expletives and nudity, especially during times when children are likely to be watching or listening.

Relaxing the current policy is not in the best interest of the public. I strongly urge the FCC to reject any and all proposals allowing the broadcasting of expletives and nudity on FCC-licensed stations.
