

I will be a grandmother this year for the first time. When I heard about the FCC proposal to change their policy to only punish deliberate and repetitive use of profanity and nudity, I got a physical ache in my gut. I fear for what my grandchildren and all children of his generation will have access to in their own homes. One nude scene or F-word is one too many. I consider one use, and especially repetitive uses, of nudity on television pornographic. The definition of pornography is 'display of sexual organs or activity.'
