Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 18, 2013, Aparna Sridhar of Google Inc. and the undersigned, along with Alan Norman of Google and Vinko Erceg, Ron Porat, and Chris Szymanski of Broadcom Corporation participating via telephone, met with Louis Peraertz, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Clyburn, about the above-captioned proceeding. In addition, the same group met with Courtney Reinhard, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Pai, on April 15. During these meetings, Google and Broadcom stated that the Commission should: (1) adopt the “51-down” band plan option, and (2) create guard bands and a duplex gap of sufficient size to avoid harmful interference between cellular operations and broadcasters. To maximize utility using this band plan, the FCC should: (1) permit consumers to use unlicensed technologies in the guard band and duplex gap found in this band plan, and (2) permit consumers to use unlicensed technologies in Channel 37 and the two channels currently reserved for wireless microphones.
