

I oppose any changes to the current Federal Communications Commission (FCC) indecency standards that would allow television and radio stations to broadcast expletives and nudity on the public airwaves, even if brief or "fleeting."

The Supreme Court has confirmed the FCC has the authority to enforce policies regarding expletives and nudity, especially during times when children are likely to be watching or listening.

Relaxing the current policy would not serve the public interest. While most media has allowed the users to self-police their behavior and actions, a standard needs to be maintained to allow for respectful behavior and speech, not gutter language and base behavior. I urge the FCC to reject all proposals that would allow for the broadcast of expletives and nudity on FCC-licensed stations.
