Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 3, 2013, on behalf of Sorenson Communications, Inc., I spoke to Nicholas Degani, Commissioner Pai's legal advisor. I discussed the chart attached as page one of Sorenson's ex parte filing in these dockets of July 11, 2012, which shows that Sorenson's debt obligations are typical of those of many communications companies. On May 6, 2013, Scott Sorensen and Reed Steiner of Sorenson and I followed up with a brief phone call with Mr. Degani, noting that Sorenson's current margins are typical as well. In addition, future margin levels were discussed under various reimbursement rate scenarios. On the May 3 call, I also pointed out that in an auction bidders will bid based on their real-world costs rather than on the limited costs treated as "allowable" under the Commission's rules.

In addition, on May 2, 2013 Sorenson filed an ex parte notification regarding meetings held on April 30, May 1, and May 2, 2013. In that filing Sorenson failed to note that Matthew Berry, Chief of Staff to Commissioner Pai, was present at the May 2, 2013 meeting between Pat Nola, Scott Sorensen and Mike Maddix of Sorenson, Jim Perry and Michael Cole of Madison Dearborn Partners, John Nakahata and I on behalf of Sorenson, along with Commissioner Pai and Nicholas Degani.
