

I am a father of two girls and would like to see the rules relaxed but in a certain way - all over-the-air broadcasts should remain under current rule, however, all cable broadcast should have their rules relaxed. If parents of minors do not want accidental or intentional exposure of profanity or nudity on cable TV, they can either disconnect their service or ban specific channels that permit this via their cable box - most of them if not all, have this feature, to lock down channels with a password that isn't easy to bypass. OTA programming cannot be controlled locally in the household, and minors can easily find means of reception without permission.

I believe this is a compromise that doesn't step on anyone's toes - those who are not and those who are offended by certain content, leaving ultimate responsibility with the person rather than forcing my views via mass agreement and/or government.
