

I live in a subdivision in Platte County Missouri that does not have broadband high speed internet access. After multiple attempts by several homeowners to request "Time Warner Cable" or "AT&T Uverse" we are still being told it is not available in our area. I have been told that when an area has a certain percentage of capacity, by law, the broadband companies must make these services accessible. Furthermore, the cable is at the bottom of the hill at the gas station and just needs ran up the hill to our subdivision. A few home owners, including myself try to conduct business from home. I purchase 20 gb through Verizon on a Mobile-"JetPack" plus we have a 15 gb plan through AT&T for our cell phones and tablets.
