I strongly oppose any changes to the current FCC indecency standards that would allow television and radio stations to broadcast expletives and nudity on the public airwaves, even if brief or "fleeting."

The root cause of essentially every problem America is facing today is directly traceable to the media and its indecent programming which has resulted in a significant decline in American morality and an increase in America's crime rates.

The Supreme Court has confirmed the FCC's authority to enforce policies regarding expletives and nudity, especially during times when children are likely to be watching or listening.

Relaxing the FCC's current indecency policy is unnecessary, will not serve the public interest and will not serve America's national interest. I therefore strongly urge the FCC to reject all proposals that would allow the broadcast of expletives and nudity on FCC-licensed stations.
