

I am writing to make my request known concerning the FCC's pending decision on the level of morality on network television, specifically lowering the aforementioned standards on language and nudity. I oppose any changes to the current FCC indecency standards that would allow television and radio stations to broadcast expletives and nudity on the public airwaves, even if brief or ???fleeting.???
