
The following reply comments are respectfully submitted by the consulting engineering firm of Cohen, Dippell and Everist, P.C. (“CDE”) and is in response to the Public Notice released by the Commission on February 11, 2013. CDE and its predecessors have practiced before the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) for over 75 years in broadcast and telecommunications matters. The firm or its predecessors have been located in Washington, DC since 1937 and performed professional consulting engineering services to the communications industry.

The FCC’s Public Notice dated February 11, 2013 (DA 13-187) indicates that the spectrum will ultimately be subject to competitive bidding. The FCC’s Public Notice dated May 17, 2013 seeks to supplement the record on the 600 MHz band plan. In the Public Notice, it is suggested that for the purpose of maximizing spectrum that mixed use across the United States should be considered.

The FCC need only research the prior history where different regulatory frame work occurred where alleged interference arose with the deployment of TV Channel 14 in Arlington, Virginia.

The FCC is urged not go forward with competitive bidding in the frequencies 470-512 MHz until the FCC adequately address, and effectively administer technical incompatibility issues that will arise when different regulatory schemes are imposed in the same frequency band. Where these different regulatory schemes are not fully understood, interference, based on past history, will result.
