On April 25, 2013, the undersigned, of the Policy and Licensing Division, Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau (Bureau), FCC, and Timothy May, Senior Policy Analyst, and Aaron Garza, Attorney Advisor, of the Policy and Licensing Division in the Bureau, had a conference call with Peter Woodford, President, VoIP Solutions, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, to discuss (1) the capabilities of nomadic VoIP services to provide automatic detection of wireless location information and (2) VoIP Solutions's update of the ex parte presentation it made to the Bureau on May 2, 2012. Concerning those matters, we discussed the following topics: the situation in European countries that are at the forefront in implementing requirements for providers of nomadic VoIP services, approaches the FCC could take to be effective in providing a regulatory backstop in coordinating efforts on 911 with the states in the U.S., and the provision of valid civic address information in the migration from the legacy 911 environment to NG-911.
