Dear Mr. Cleaver:

The Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau (Bureau) of the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) advises you that, for the reasons stated below, your above-referenced petition for exemption from the FCC's closed captioning rules has been dismissed as incomplete.

The Bureau advised you by letter dated April 5, 2012, that, unless you submitted the information and materials outlined in the letter that were missing from your petition by July 5, 2012, your petition would be dismissed on July 5, 2012.<sup>1</sup> As requested by the Bureau and as cautioned in the Bureau's letter, your petition was dismissed without prejudice on July 5, 2012, because you failed to submit the following:

- documentation of your financial status;
- verification that you have sought closed captioning assistance from your video programming distributor;
- information about the costs associated with captioning your program;
- verification that you have sought additional sponsorship sources or other sources of revenue for captioning; and
- information on the type of your operation and the impact that providing caption would have on your programming activities, for example, the extent to which your programming might not be shown if you are required to provide captions.

We remind you that, as also noted in the Bureau's letter, with this dismissal, you must comply with the FCC's closed captioning requirements contained in Part 79 of the FCC's rules with regard to the programming that was the subject of your petition.
