

I support Sun Sounds of Arizona request and comment with the Federal Communications Commission in proceeding 13-86. I sincerely hope that the Commission will grant the exemption because: 1. Sun Sounds reading service on radio is the same as the printed page to me and it's audience. 2. The existing indecency rules we're not intended to apply to published print that I listen to as read on Sun Sounds of Arizona.

Printed newspapers, magazines, and books are not censored by the government in print or recorded formats so my listening them through Sun Sounds should not be censored.

Sun Sounds of Arizona uses HD Radio to serve people who are blind and disabled?people like myself who find it very difficult or impossible to read print matter. I am able to simply tune to the proper HD channel and can immediately hear daily newspapers, grocery ads, and other print news. I cannot otherwise hear this news, despite having mailed an application, received delivery of an SCA radio only to find that my location does not receive the signal?despite its being in the listening area.

People with disabilities have a right to equal access to current printed news on a par with sighted or unimpaired peers.

We have a right to uncensored education, literature and information.
