About: Raw Fear will air between 11pm-12am on Saturday Nights for Thirteen Weeks Straight.


Each show will air only one time on WPMY-TV.

Reason for Exemption: Our budget is estimated around \$8,000 for the show. That includes paying \$6,500 for airtime plus other required production expenses. Therefore, it would be financially burdensome for us to pay for closed captioning for the show with costs alone for closed captioning being \$5,000-\$9,000 on top of our regular budget. Each episode will only air one time this season for thirteen-straight weeks. We got a couple of different quotes from a well-trusted Closed-Captioning Business (see attached document). We are a local Pittsburgh-based production company and having the show airing on a local Pittsburgh Station.

Closed Captioning Price

Caption Prep:

1. Pop-on - \$600 per hour billed in 15-minute increments - \$600 for the 60-minute program
2. Roll-up - \$300 per hour billed in 15-minute increments - \$300 for the 60-minute program

Encoding:

Digital encoding for 60-minute program - \$150

So, depending on whether you need pop-on or roll-up, the cost for each episode will either be \$750 or \$450. For the 13-episode season, either \$9,750 or \$5,850.
