Dear Ms. Dortch:

On August 2, 2013, Frederick M. Joyce, James Arden Barnett, Jr., and Tiffany M. Nichols of the law firm Venable LLP, attorneys representing TruePosition, Inc., a member of the Find Me 911 Coalition, met with David Turetsky, Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau (PSHSB) Chief, Tim May, Communications Specialist and Project Manager for Next Generation 9-1-1, David Siehl, Legal Counsel, and David Furth, Deputy Bureau Chief of the PSHSB, at the Federal Communications Commission (FCC). Dana Zelman, Legal Counsel, and Erica Olsen, Special Counsel to the PSHSB joined via teleconference.

The meeting was convened on behalf of the constituency of the Find Me 911 Coalition. The Coalition consists of over 105,000 individuals and a dozen organizations so far. The individual members are a broad range of 9-1-1 call-takers, operators and first responders, and the organizations include the U.S. First Responders Association, the International Union of Police Associations, and the American Academy of Emergency Medicine. The number of individual members and organizations continues to grow. The Coalition advocates that the FCC move forward with adopting technology-neutral, reasonable rules that set benchmarks for indoor location accuracy, similar to those for outdoor location accuracy. Further, the Coalition urged the FCC to make indoor location accuracy a priority.

Meeting attendees also discussed the Communications Security, Reliability and Interoperability Council (CSRIC) indoor location accuracy test bed results and the subsequent testing done by TruePosition, Inc., with the same independent third party using the CSRIC methodology. Further, meeting attendees discussed the technical and logistical aspects of establishing indoor location accuracy rules, including implementation, testing concepts, and the costs and benefits associated with implementing the rules.
