Re: Amending Sorenson Communication Inc.’s Application for Certification as a Provider of iTRS to Exclude IP Relay, Structure and Practices of the Video Relay Service Program; Telecommunications Relay Services and Speech-to-Speech Services for Individuals with Hearing and Speech Disabilities, CG Docket Nos. 10-51 & 03-123.

Dear Ms. Dortch:

By this letter Sorenson Communications, Inc., (“Sorenson”) amends its Application for Certification as a Provider of Internet-Based TRS (“Application”). Sorenson filed its Application on December 2, 2011,¹ and filed an updated application on December 3, 2012, (“Updated Application”).² In its Application and Updated Application Sorenson sought certification to provide Video Relay Service (“VRS”), IP Captioned Telephone Service (“IP CTS”), and IP Relay service. On July 8, 2013, Sorenson informed the Federal Communications Commission that it would no longer provide IP Relay service as of July 31, 2013.³ Accordingly, Sorenson no longer seeks certification to provide IP Relay service. Sorenson hereby withdraws the portion of the Application and Updated Application that sought certification to provide IP Relay service, but Sorenson continues to seek certification to provide VRS and IP CTS.
