Dear Federal Communications Commission,

Thank you for carrying out your duty under Scenic Hudson to create a complete record of your findings about radio frequency exposure and to seriously consider my comments in order to fulfill your obligation to represent the public interest.

I request that you make a direct request to the EPA to use its taxpayer funded resources and experts present at its National Risk Management Research Lab to conduct all of the cost analysis it has asked for in this proceeding.

I urge you to seriously investigate current scientific research and policy in other countries that have far more stringent radio frequency exposure guidelines than are currently present in the United States. RFR limits in the United States are currently amongst the least protective in the world.

I also ask you to review the 2012-13 Bioinitiative Report in order to accurately update current FCC guidelines about radio frequency exposure.

Current FCC safety limits never anticipated wireless industry health impacts and do not protect against the biological effects of RFR. The thermal model is now obsolete.

I urge you to make radio frequency regulations more restrictive to protect public health. This is a serious public health issue that must not be ignored.
