**Sweetwater Cable Television Co.'s Request for Renewal of Financial Hardship Waiver**

**In the Matter of the Commercial Advertisement Loudness Mitigation (CALM) Act,  
MB Docket No. 11-93**

On behalf of Sweetwater Cable Television Co. (FRN # 0010338333) serving Sweetwater County, Wyoming ("Sweetwater"), I, Al Carollo, hereby request that the Commission renew Sweetwater's streamlined financial hardship waiver of the Commercial Advertisement Loudness Mitigation (CALM) Act rules for one additional year. Sweetwater timely filed its initial streamlined waiver request on September 19, 2012, which was presumed granted upon electronic confirmation of its filing.

Pursuant to the December 13, 2011, Report and Order in the above-captioned proceeding, I certify that as the 52nd largest cable MVPD (as of the FCC's Fourteenth Video Competition Report, which was the first issued following the CALM Act Order referenced above), serving two communities with approximately 6,600 combined subscribers in Rock Springs and Green River, Wyoming, Sweetwater: (1) has fewer than 15,000 subscribers and therefore meets the Commission's definition of a small MVPD system; and (2) needs a delay of an additional year to avoid the financial hardship that would otherwise be imposed if it were required to obtain sooner the necessary upgraded ad insertion equipment and purchase audio monitoring equipment, such as Tektronix's Sentry Assure.

I represent and warrant that the above certification is consistent with 47. C.F.R. § 1.17 which requires truthful and accurate statements to the Commission. I also acknowledge that false statements and misrepresentations to the Commission are punishable under Title 18 of the U.S. Code and may subject Sweetwater to enforcement action.
