Dear Ms. Dortch:

On July 24, 2012, Frontier Communications Corp. filed to accept all of its eligible funding from Phase I of the Connect America Fund.¹ By accepting all eligible funding, Frontier pledged to serve 92,877 qualifying locations by July 24, 2015. On July 24, 2013, Frontier provided the latitude and longitude information for each of the 92,877 locations for which it accepted support.² Today's filing provides notice that Frontier will be replacing 770 of those locations with 840 different locations.³

There are two attached files to this letter, each containing 2010 Census Block FIPS code, NECA Company Code (OCN), wire center CLLI code, and latitude and longitude of individual CAF Phase I round 1 locations. One file contains the list of locations to which Frontier will no longer deploy while the other file contains the new list of locations to which Frontier will deploy in their place. Frontier will have deployed to 67% of its total locations by July 24, 2014, and 100% by July 25, 2015.
