

In addition, potential subscribers are scattered throughout the service area. The single largest cluster of homes within the service area is 30 residences located in Smoke Signal, AZ. All remaining homes are scattered throughout the service area, and there are multiple instances in which single homes are located over 1 mile from either another home or the proposed fiber backbone.

Apart from very low population density, Navajo Pillars Telco's extremely high build-out costs are driven by challenges of serving a remote, hard to reach area. The closest town of any substantial population is Chinle, AZ (population 20,281), which is located approximately 35.9 miles from the eastern border of the proposed service area. Within the service area, there is only one retail convenience store that sells gasoline and food. Moreover, in the event of an injury during construction of the network, the nearest medical facility is located more than 35 miles from the eastern border of the service area.

Navajo Pillars Telco's location in an arid region further adds to the company's high estimated costs. The service area contains very few bodies of water and receives only 12 to 16 inches of rain annually. Water is available in less than 50% of the service area, making the provisioning of construction crews costly, especially during summer months when temperatures reach the high 80's. Furthermore, this climate provides for very hard soil that significantly increases the costs of building and maintaining a communications network.

Finally, the entire service area is located in a valley at altitudes between 6,100 to 6,700 feet, and surrounded by mesas (high plateaus) at approximately 7,200 feet above sea level. This significantly prohibits the availability of satellite or microwave backhaul capabilities. Consequently, Navajo Pillars Telco's fiber backbone is designed to extend to Frontier's network

located at the intersection of Highway 191 and Highway 4.¹³¹ The extension of the fiber backbone is more costly than a satellite or microwave backhaul, but necessary due to the geography of the service area.

2. Alternative Providers

There are no alternative providers of voice telephony or broadband services in the proposed service area. The area is completely unserved.

3. Corporate Operations

Navajo Pillars Telco's Corporate Operations expenses forecasts can be found on page 4 of its Five-Year Pro Forma Financial Analysis, which is attached as Exhibit N.

4. End User Rate Plans

Navajo Pillars Telco plans to offer the end-user rate plans outlined in Exhibit L.

5. List of Services Other Than Voice Services Provided Over USF Supported Plant

In addition to voice services provided over USF supported plant, Navajo Pillars Telco plans to offer Digital Subscriber Line ("DSL") and fiber-to-the-home service to any requesting subscriber. Navajo Pillars Telco also plans to offer dedicated special access circuits to anchor institutions, utility companies, and Tribal government institutions.

6. Customers Served

Navajo Pillars Telco does not serve any customers presently. By Year 5, Navajo Pillars Telco estimates it will serve approximately 908 subscribers.

7. Procedures for Allocating Shared or Common Costs Between Regulated and Nonregulated Services or Operations

Navajo Pillars Telco currently does not plan to offer any non-regulated services. To the extent Navajo Pillars Telco offers non-regulated services in the future, the carrier will employ cost allocation procedures that comply with the requirements set forth in Section 64.901.

8. Audited Financial Statements

Navajo Pillars Telco does not have any audited financial statements. The company is not receiving revenue at this point.

9. Information Regarding Outstanding Loans

Navajo Pillars Telco currently has no outstanding loans. The RUS has informed the company that it cannot obtain an RUS loan without the relief requested herein.

10. Five-Year Pro Forma Financial Analysis

Navajo Pillars Telco had an independent accounting firm prepare a financial analysis of the projected impact of the grant of this Petition. The financial analysis is attached as Exhibit N.

11. Identification of the Specific Facilities That Will Be Taken Out of Service

Without Commission grant of the waivers requested herein, Navajo Pillars Telco will not be able to obtain a loan from the RUS, the network will not be constructed, and the region will remain unserved.

XII. THE COMMISSION SHOULD GRANT ANY ADDITIONAL WAIVERS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE IMMEDIATE PROVISION OF BASIC AND ADVANCED TELECOMMUNICATIONS SERVICES TO THE NAVAJO PEOPLE IN THE PROPOSED SERVICE AREA

To the extent any additional waivers are necessary to expedite Navajo Pillars Telco's receipt of USF support and participation in the NECA pools and tariffs, Navajo Pillars Telco respectfully requests that such waivers be considered and granted on the Commission's own

motion. Moreover, if some waivers requested herein will require substantially more time for review than others, Navajo Pillars Telco also asks that such waiver requests be severed and those requiring less time be rules upon while review of the others is pending.

XIII. CONCLUSION

For the foregoing reasons, Navajo Pillars Telco respectfully requests that the Commission expeditiously grant this Petition for ETC designation and the waivers of the Commission rules described herein. ETC designation and these waivers will serve the public interest by allowing Navajo Pillars Telco to provide high-quality basic and advanced telecommunications services to an unserved area of the Navajo Nation. Granting the requested waivers will also ensure administration of the USF in a manner consistent with the Commission's goal of assisting local exchange carriers serving high-cost rural areas and maintaining affordable local service rates and the public interest.





Fiber Connection Points











RESOLUTION OF BLUE GAP/TACHEE CHAPTER

SUPPORTING PILLARS TELECOMMUNICATS, INC. (PTI) TO CREATE AND ESTABLISH A TELECOMMUNICATION BUSINESS.

WHEREAS:

1. Pursuant to the Navajo Tribe, Navajo Nation ("Nation"), Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter House of the Navajo Nation has the authority to represent the Tribe and act in all matters that concerns the welfare of the Navajo Tribe; **AND**
2. The Navajo Nation Tribal Council encourages and endorses entrepreneurial ventures by enrolled tribal members in its ongoing commitment to increased self-determination; **AND**
3. The Navajo Nation Tribal Council recognizes the significant shortage of employment opportunities within the reservation communities; **AND**
4. George L. Martinez, is an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation, is present and requests approval from the Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter House of the Navajo Nation to establish a Native-owned telecommunication business titled Pillars Telecommunications, Inc.; **AND**
5. George L. Martinez intends to register his company with the State of Arizona as Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. and Navajo native-owned; **AND**
6. Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. understands the risks which are inherent in starting a new business and at the Same time it understands that a well developed plan mitigates and reduces exposure to risk and that there are potential economic benefits and rewards for trial members beyond what is currently available; with this action it models a vision of entrepreneurial spirit in an understanding economic environment. **AND**
7. Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. has an ongoing communication through an independent professional consultant with a federal funding agency that is prepared to fund an established company that has submitted of all pertinent documents before March 1, 2010 and is separated and independent of a tribal government; **AND**
8. Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. has a promising opportunity to receive federal funding through Rural Utilities Service Programs that is provided by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA); **AND**
9. Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. requests the Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter House support and approval to offer to provide telecommunication services to every home, business and governmental agency on the Navajo Nation Reservation; **AND**

10. Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Tribe and any of its department, officers or employees from any and all liability, claims, damages, and expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) arising out of or resulting from Pillars Telecommunications' act or omissions or negligence by Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. or anyone who acts for or on behalf of Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. in carrying out the work as defined in the pertinent document; **AND**
11. Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. will execute its plan to replace the existing telecommunication service provider and to maintain all services, programs and privileges assigned or designate thereto with intention to upgrade the systems immediately after receiving approval; **AND**
12. Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. is willing to offer eth Navajo Nation the first rights of refusal to purchase Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. five to seven years after it opens for business.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter House of the Navajo Nation that it hereby:

1. Consents to George L. Martinez doing business as Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. and hereby approves to support, pursuant to the Navajo Nation business code.
2. Consents that George L. Martinez, intends to register his company with the state of Arizona and that it is officially known as Pillars Telecommunications, Inc.
3. Gives approval for Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. to apply for federal funding with USDA through the Rural Utilities Service Programs.
4. Agrees that Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. is the solely entity that is responsible for any and all loans granted to it.
5. Accepts the aforementioned indemnification statement by Pillars Telecommunications, Inc.
6. Gives support approval for Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. to begin its plan to replace the current existing telecommunication service provider and to maintain all services, programs, and privileges assigned or designated thereto with intention to upgrade the systems.
7. Accepts the statement made by Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. about its willingness to offer the Navajo Nation the first rights of refusal to purchase the company in five to seven years after it opens for business.
8. By the Blue Gap/Tachee Chapter House of the Navajo Nation that Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. is not a Navajo Tribal Enterprise and is not an arm of the Navajo Nation.

RESOLUTION OF PINON CHAPTER HOUSE of the NAVAJO NATION

[Supporting Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. (NPT) to create and establish a telecommunications business]

1. Pursuant to the Navajo Tribe, Navajo Nation ("Nation"), Pinon Chapter House of the Navajo Nation has the authority to represent the Tribe in all matters that concerns the welfare of the Navajo Tribe; and
2. the Navajo Nation Tribal Council encourages and endorses entrepreneurial ventures by enrolled tribal members in its ongoing commitment to increased sovereignty and self-determination; and
3. the Navajo Nation Tribal Council recognizes the significant shortage of employment opportunities within the reservation communities; and
4. George L. Martinez, is an enrolled member of the Navajo Nation, is present and requests approval from the Pinon Chapter House of the Navajo Nation to establish a Business titled to Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc.; and
5. Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. understands the risks which are inherent in starting a new business and at the same time it understands that a well developed plan mitigates and reduces exposure to risk and that there are potential economic benefits and rewards for tribal members beyond what is currently available; with this action it models a vision of entrepreneurial spirit in an understanding economic environment; and
6. Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. has a opportunity to receive federal funding through Rural Utilities Service Programs that is provided by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA); and
7. Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Navajo Tribe and any of its department, officers or employees from any and all liability, claims, damages, and expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees) arising out of or resulting from Navajo Pillars Telecommunications' act or omissions or negligence by NPT, Inc. or anyone who acts for or on behalf of NPT, Inc. in carrying out the work as defined in the pertinent document.; and

8. Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. requests the Pinon Chapter House support and approval to offer to provide telecommunication services to every home, business and governmental agency on the Navajo Nation Reservation; and
9. Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. will replace the existing telecommunication service provider (Frontier Communications Inc.) and to maintain all services, programs and privileges assigned or designated thereto with intention to upgrade the systems immediately after receiving approval; and
10. Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. is willing to offer the Navajo Nation the first rights of refusal to purchase Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. and business site in seven years after it opens for business.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Pinon Chapter House of the Navajo



**Petition of Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. For Contingent Certificate Of
Convenience And Necessity**

Navajo Pillars Telecommunications, Inc. (“Pillars”) respectfully requests the issuance of a certificate of convenience and necessity (“CCN”) contingent upon the adoption by the Navajo Nation Telecommunications Regulatory Commission (“NNTRC”) of a final CCN application and associated rules and a demonstration of compliance with such application and rules by Pillars.

Pillars is a telecommunications carrier wholly-owned by a member of the Navajo Nation.¹ In the near future, Pillars plans to submit a petition to the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”) requesting an eligible telecommunications carrier (“ETC”) designation for the Smoke Signal and Blue Gap Chapter Houses region.² The Smoke Signal and Blue Gap regions that Pillars proposes to serve are located entirely within the boundaries of the Navajo Nation. The requested contingent CCN will assist Pillars in obtaining this ETC designation, which, in turn, will enable Pillars to receive financial support from the FCC’s universal service program. Without financial support from the universal service program, Pillars will not be able

to deploy infrastructure necessary for the provision of telecommunications services in this unserved region. Accordingly, Pillars requests expedited grant of this Petition.

On July 28, 2011, the NNTRC published a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (“NPRM”) proposing a CCN application for telecommunications operators to utilize when seeking to provide service on the Navajo Nation. Publication of the proposed CCN application was a monumental moment for the NNTRC, which is directed by the Navajo Nation Telecommunications Regulatory Act to “promulgate and issue specific rules and regulations establishing filing and information requirements for applications for certificates of convenience and necessity.”³ Pillars applauds the NNTRC for taking this historic step towards fulfilling its statutory duties. Establishing a formal process for obtaining CCNs will help ensure that carriers serving the Navajo Nation are technically and financially qualified to provide telecommunications services. Such qualified carriers will be more likely to deploy and maintain state-of-the-art telecommunications infrastructure and facilities that are long overdue in many parts of the Navajo Nation.

Since the publication of the NPRM, the NNTRC has issued a Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in which it proposed a revised CCN application, but it has not issued a final CCN application or associated rules. Pillars understands that the NNTRC will not be issuing any final CCNs until the NNTRC adopts a final CCN application and associated rules. Consequently, Pillars hereby requests a contingent CCN while the NNTRC finalizes the CCN application and associated rules.⁴

The issuance of a contingent CCN to Pillars will assist the carrier in obtaining an ETC designation from the FCC. Specifically, the contingent CCN will help more clearly demonstrate that the FCC, and not the Arizona Corporation Commission, holds jurisdiction to designate Pillars as an ETC. Section 214(e)(6) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, directs the FCC to perform ETC designations in those instances where the carrier is not subject to state jurisdiction.⁵ The FCC has determined that carriers seeking designation from the FCC for the provision of service on tribal lands must demonstrate that the state commission lacks jurisdiction over the carrier seeking designation.⁶ A contingent CCN here will remove any doubt, to the extent any exists, that the Arizona Corporation Commission lacks jurisdiction over Pillars.⁷

A contingent CCN will demonstrate that both Pillars and the NNTRC recognize the NNTRC's regulatory authority over and the applicability of the Navajo Nation's laws to the proposed operations of Pillars within the Navajo Nation. With respect to NNTRC's regulatory authority, Pillars' CCN application recognizes that certification requirements for telecommunications providers are determined by the NNTRC and that no person may engage in

providing telecommunications services within the Navajo Nation without first having obtained a CCN from the NNTRC.⁸ Regarding the applicability of the Navajo Nation's laws, the application acknowledges that Pillars "is subject to Navajo Nation laws of general application for businesses operating on the Navajo Nation."⁹

The FCC has found previously that a carrier's "consensual relationship" with a tribe, whereby the carrier and tribe agreed to the tribe's regulatory authority and application of tribal law over the carrier's operations within the tribal boundaries, was an important factor in determining that a state lacked jurisdiction over the carrier.¹⁰ Here, Pillars believes that a contingent CCN will demonstrate a similar consensual relationship between Pillars and the NNTRC and lead the FCC to reach a similar conclusion. Moreover, a contingent CCN may expedite the grant of an ETC designation to Pillars, which has been a lengthy process for some carriers who have sought ETC designation to provide service to the Navajo Nation.¹¹

Finally, a grant of a contingent CCN is in the public interest. Pillars plans to deploy a telecommunications network in an area of the Navajo Nation where service has never been made

available. In order to make this project financially viable, Pillars will require an ETC designation, which will enable Pillars to receive financial support from the federal universal service program. The issuance of the contingent CCN will enable Pillars to seek such an ETC designation at the FCC while the NNTRC finalizes its CCN application and rules. In essence, the contingent CCN will help Pillars expedite the timeframe upon which it will provide telecommunications services to the residents and business of the Smoke Signal and Blue Gap Chapter Houses.

Accordingly, Pillars requests that the NNTRC grant this Petition and issue Pillars a contingent CCN on an expedited basis.
