Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Wednesday, September 18, 2013, Bill Roughton, Stacey Black, and Joan Marsh of AT&T, and Austin Schlick and Aparna Sridhar of Google met with John Leibovitz, Brian Regan, and Paul Powell of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau and Renée Gregory of the Office of Engineering and Technology to discuss issues related to the matter captioned above.

The parties expressed their view that the Commission should establish broad eligibility criteria for the priority access tier, including allowing access by commercial mobile operators, in order to encourage the development of mass-market, commercial-scale technologies for this band. In addition, the parties expressed their belief that the geographical exclusion zones, which should be designed solely to protect incumbent users, do not need to be as large as proposed in the NPRM because the 3.5 GHz band does not lend itself to macro-cellular networks. Rather, the band is better suited to support small, low power, low height cells whose reduced emissions present a diminished possibility of interference to the incumbents.

Finally, the Parties encouraged the Commission pursue the three-tier framework set forth in the PCAST report.
