Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 18, 2013, representatives of the Wireless Internet Service Providers Association (“WISPA”) met with members of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, the International Bureau and the Office of Engineering and Technology to discuss the above-referenced pending rulemaking proceeding. Attending on behalf of WISPA were Chuck Hogg, Elizabeth Bowles, Alex Phillips, Dan Lubar and undersigned counsel to WISPA. Attending on behalf of the Commission were John Leibovitz, Renee Gregory, Paul Powell, Brian Regan, Kamran Etehad, Robert Nelson, Robert Pavlak and Mark Settle.

The Commission attendees indicated that the Commission is planning to seek comment on additional proposals issues relevant to the proceeding. The WISPA attendees emphasized the benefits of the 3550-3650 MHz band to their fixed wireless broadband operations, especially in rural areas. They stated that broadband is becoming increasingly more important for “work at home” needs, and that additional bandwidth adjacent to the existing 3650-3700 MHz band would enable wider channels and greater capacity. They further stated that equipment for the 3550-3650 MHz band is readily available and could be quickly placed in operation.

The WISPA attendees noted their strong support for rules that would enable higher power fixed wireless broadband operations in rural areas under a database registration system that would help coordinate licensed and unlicensed operations. WISPA indicated that it would continue to participate in the proceeding.
