On September 23, 2013, David Bogaty, CEO of WorldNet Telecommunications, Inc. (“WorldNet”) and Lawrence Freedman from the law firm of Edwards Wildman Palmer LLP, representing WorldNet, met with Sean Lev, Jonathan Chambers, Steve Wildman, and Stephanie Weiner of the Technology Transitions Task Force. In this meeting, Mr. Bogaty and Mr. Freedman explained that WorldNet is a locally-owned, Puerto Rico competitive local exchange company serving predominantly business and government customers in Puerto Rico. They discussed the views of WorldNet, as laid out in its filings of February 25, 2013 in GN Docket Nos. 13-5 and 12-353, and August 7, 2013 in GN Docket No. 13-5, regarding the current proposals for the ‘IP transition.’ WorldNet expressed concern about the impacts in Puerto Rico, and urged the commission to exercise caution and consider measures to balance the impact on competition in whatever it determines to do.
